

Neighborhood Clean-Up 2006 Program Description

Clean-Up Omaha is a program of the City of Omaha and managed by a cooperative effort of Keep Omaha Beautiful, neighborhood and community groups and the City of Omaha. The City's program began in 1982 to promote clean, safe and comfortable community environments.

Quick Facts

- Last year over 1,100 tons of unwanted bulky items were disposed of at the landfill
- 100 tons of scrap tires, 700 junk appliances, and 300 truck loads of brush were recycled
- More than 3,500 volunteer hours from neighborhood groups make this program successful
- 101 groups will participate in Clean-Up Omaha this year (up from 92 last year!)
- All OMAHA RESIDENCES are eligible for Clean-Up Omaha
- The program runs for FIVE Saturdays (April 22 – May 20)
- Clean-up sites are open from 9 a.m. - 2 p.m.
- Sites only accept materials that cannot be set out for regular garbage or recyclable collection. Examples: broken or unusable bulky items like furniture, mattresses, televisions
- Each weekend there will be a site that can accept TIRES
- Each weekend there will be a site that can accept APPLIANCES such as stoves and refrigerators
- NO SITE will accept - commercial waste, waste from commercial haulers, rocks, concrete, yard waste, paint, liquids or hazardous materials
- Omahans with a load of brush or oversize tree limbs must pick up a voucher at one of the clean-up sites; the voucher will pay for the disposal/processing costs of ONE load hauled to River City Recycling on that Saturday

2006 CLEAN UP DAYS

<u>Date</u>	<u>Part of the City</u>
April 22	Mostly Southwest Omaha – approximately, Dodge St. to Harrison St., 72 nd St. to the western city limits
April 29	Mostly South Central and Southeast Omaha – approximately, Cuming St. to Harrison St., the Missouri River to 72 nd St.
May 6	Mostly Mid and East Central Omaha – approximately, Maple St. to Pacific St., the Missouri River to 84 th St.; also Miller Park/Minne Lusa, Belvedere Point, Florence, and Ames Ave to Wirt St., 24 th St. to the North Freeway
May 13	Mostly North Central and Northeast Omaha – approximately, Redick Ave. to Hamilton St., 11 th St. to 60 th St.
May 20	Mostly Northwest Omaha – approximately, the northern city limits to Dodge St., 48 th St. to the western city limits; also Stony Brook
