National Night Out To Be Held Tuesday, August 1st

The 23rd "National Night Out" (NNO) has been scheduled for Tuesday, August 1st. This unique crime/ drug prevention event is sponsored by the Omaha Police Department, is part of Citizen Corps, and all are invited to be part of a nation-wide event. NNO has proven to be an effective, inexpensive, and enjoyable program to promote neighborhood spirit and policecommunity partnerships in the fight for a safer nation. The benefits the community derives from NNO extends well beyond the one night.

Last year's NNO campaign involved citizens, law enforcement agencies, civic groups, businesses, neighborhood organizations and local officials from over 10,000 communities from all 50 states, U.S. territories, Canadian cities, and military bases worldwide.

This will be the fifth year that the GPNA has participated in the National Night Out celebration. On Tuesday evening, August 1, 33rd Street will be blocked off from California to Cass for the event. EVERYONE is welcome to participate and have a good time. It's a great opportunity to get together and show your support for our neighborhood in a big way.

The GPNA plans to include many of the same activities as at last year's event - including food, refreshments, jazz, firetruck, face painting, moonwalk, water balloon toss, information booths (health, safety, neighborhood), and much more. The **Omaha Bicycle Co-op** invites you to help in our community bicycle project. We are a group of bicycle enthusiasts that are organizing operations for an Omaha community bicycle co-op. The bicycle co-op consists of tools, bike stands, bike parts, and volunteers—all of which build our community. Few establishments are available where one may repair their bicycle or become outfitted with safe cycling knowledge, safety equipment, and a bicycle! We are dedicated to living out pillars of service, justice, community, simplicity, self responsibility to self and community.

In accords with those values, we have undertaken our first community bicycle coop. Through donations and our hard labor our co-op hopes to bring about a place of growth for our community. Our co-op plans to organize knowledgeable bicycle safety, pleasurable rides, repair workshops and a variety of other functions that will build and draw people together. Our co-op will not only be involving our immediate community, but all of Omaha.

As bicycle and community enthusiasts, our co-op hopes to bring enthusiasm, drive, hard work and a sense of belonging. Flower Pots Attractive Addition To Business District

Have you noticed the new flower pots in the 33rd & California Street business district? If you haven't, take a few minutes to walk through the area and check them out. This is a cooperative effort between the business owners and the GPNA to take a couple small steps toward beautification in the area. This effort actually started last year when GPNA member Jay Genoa helped us get 4 large flower pots donated through Mulhall's Nursery. Then this year, Mulhall's Nursery gave us a great deal on 4 more pots and donated plant material. The business owners funded the cost of flower pots and more flowers. We also received funding from the Mayor's grant. So on May 10, Indian **Creek Nursery** supplied a truck and good dirt and filled all eight pots. That same evening volunteers planted sweet potato plants, coleus, petunias, zinnias, vinca, marigolds, and canna (for height in the middle). Weeding and watering will be done by employees of several local businesses. The GPNA wishes to thank the **City of Omaha** and other private donors who helped keep the Sun Dawgs program and for making it possible for Gifford Park to be a full-time site; this means a lot to our neighborhood.

The Omaha Public Library and the Cosmopolitan-UNMC College of Nursing Mobile Nursing Center will offer free Mobile Health Care Clinics, for ages 19 and up.
