CONFERENCE, EXHIBITION, AND TOUR November 3 – 5, 2006

The **Restore Omaha Conference, Exhibition** and **Tour** is back **November 3-5** with new topics, familiar faces, intensive hands-on workshops and a great new tour.

Preservation Consultant **Bob Yapp** will return as the keynote speaker November 4 at the University of Nebraska at Omaha's Strauss Performing Arts Center.

This year Yapp will speak on restoring entire neighborhoods, not just individual homes. "Diversity in a neighborhood is key according," said Yapp. "It is important to have families of all income levels living together in a neighborhood." With his wit and humor Yapp promises to motivate attendees to take action to make their neighborhoods a diverse, friendly, rewarding and safe place to live.

Following Yapp's 9 a.m. presentation, attendees can visit up to 50 exhibitor booths in UNO's Milo Bail Student Center from 10:30 to 12:30 as well as a bookstore and tool area to gather ideas, products, contacts and solutions that address older property needs. In the afternoon attendees can choose from 19 different breakout sessions. Sessions include Rejuvenation's **Bo Sullivan** speaking on period lighting, Virginia Tech University's **Dr. Marilyn Casto** addressing early kitchens and bathroom styles and panels of local experts sharing lessons learned in both residential restorations and commercial restorations. Conference prices is \$20 in advance or \$25 at the door.

Sunday morning, November 5, Metropolitan Community College South Omaha campus will host intensive handson workshops at their Industrial Training Center. Attendees can choose one two-to-four hour workshop to attend. Topics include window repair, plaster repair,

Midtown Candidate Forum

Midtown Neighborhood Alliance (MNA) is offering a candidate "Meet and Greet" on October 11, 2006 from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Field Club of Omaha (3615 Woolworth Avenue.) All candidates running for an election in our area are invited to have a table and answer one-on-one questions from area residents. The GPNA will not have a candidate forum this year so get the answers to your questions about the candidates' issues and position!

Community Benefits Agreement (CBA)

Residents will hear this term more in the coming years. A CBA is a legally enforceable contract signed by community groups (non-profits, neighborhood and business associations, churches, unions, public entities, etc) and by a developer, setting forth a range of community benefits that the developer agrees to provide as part of a development. MNA voted to move forward with a potential CBA and pursue a dialog with Mutual of Omaha regarding their new retail/residential development west of Turner Park between Dodge and Harney. MNA will focus specifically on public spaces including streets and Turner Park amenities but will also explore other CBA's possibilities to address public safety.
