Despite a day that started out cloudy and damp and numerous other social events on that day, we had a steady stream of cars and trucks from 9:00AM to nearly 2:00PM. We ended up almost filling two compactor trucks, and Eric McGhee, our metal recycler, and his helpers completely filled three large trailers. We also handed out a dozen vouchers for free brush disposal. Many thanks to **Jim Wilwerding** for leading the efforts. Several crews circulated throughout the neighborhood picking up discarded items. Thanks to Chris Foster, Luther Larson, Dan Bodmann, Bob Hutton, Paul Mileris, Jim Kyler and Terry Wilwerding for that duty. Mike Caban kindly volunteered to direct traffic, provide renewal reminders to errant exmembers, and generate positive PR to newcomers. Others who helped were **Neil Liberty** (garage sale items) and **Roger Freeman**. The high point of the day was seeing two neighbors wheeling a couch on top of a shopping cart down 34th Street to the cleanup site (see below). We also had numerous loads delivered by wheelbarrow and several neighbors hand-carried refuse from nearby lots. Clearly plenty of can-do attitude exists in our neighborhood. Finally, a big "Thank You" to the City of Omaha and Keep Omaha Beautiful for sponsoring the event, providing compactor trucks free of charge as well as free brush vouchers. Thanks to everyone who participated in making the neighborhood a better (and neater) place for all who live here.

Gifford Park Grant Update

This grant season has been very kind to the Gifford Park Neighborhood Association. We have applied for and received 3 grants totalling \$17,400 from **The Kiewit Foundation**, **Mutual of Omaha Foundation** and **City of Omaha** (**Mayor's Grant**). These grants will help to fund the following items in areas indicated:

Free Weather Preparedness Class

Are you and your family prepared to survive the spring storms?

If you live in the Midlands you understand the need to be prepared to protect yourself and your family during periods of severe weather. In most cases the government will not be able to support your needs for days or even weeks. Your survival may depend on your own personal life skills. Eastern Nebraska Community Emergency **Response Team** (CERT) offers a free 20 hour class created by the Department of Homeland Security to teach you survival skills. The next class is offered on June 24th, 25th, and 26th, 2011. You need to attend all 3 days. Additionally, if you were not directly affected by the severe weather event, this class will give you the skills to help others in the community who were. The registration deadline is **Tuesday**, **June 21st**. Registration, the hours of class, and additional information is available at www.easternnebraskacert.com or by calling 402.680.8705.

Report Crime

This is a great opportunity for us as a neighborhood to help law enforcement and help our own neighborhood, especially this time of year as the weather gets warmer and more people are out. Here's things you can do: Observe and report suspicious activity (it's the right thing to do and it helps to document issues). When calling 911 be willing to meet with officers even if you meet at a nearby location (the call will be given a higher priority). If possible, take pictures and provide as much information as you can. Northeast Police Precinct Crime Prevention Specialist Theola Cooper (444-3367, Theola.Cooper@ci.omaha.ne.us) is an excellent resource to contact if you have specific information on problem issues. Remember the old saying "If you are not part of the solution, you are part of the problem."

Ok, I know summer doesn't officially begin until June 21st, but with the weather we've been having, it sure seems like it's already here. For the Community Bike Project, that means we're hopping! With school



out and everyone itching to ride a bike, our Open Shop hours on Wed/Thurs nights and Sat afternoons are busy. That means we can always use a hand in the shop, mostly helping us keep the Shop from devolving into chaos. If you have any bike mechanical skills, that's just a bonus. Please send an email to <u>matt@communitybikeproject.org</u> if you want to help out, and I'll get you scheduled for a shift.

In other news, our next round of bike classes are starting soon! We're offering two different sets of classes now: one focusing on safe bicycling skills and the other focused on bike mechanics and repair. We've teamed up with Metro Community College to teach these classes, so you can now get official certificates for completing the whole class curriculum for each. To sign up for the classes, go to MCC's website and look under "Continuing Ed" and then "Sports & Games." The cost is \$19/class with discounts if you sign up for the whole course all at once. The tuition allows us to pay our instructors something for their time, as well as to help support CBPO. All classes will be taught at the Community Bike Shop in Gifford Park.
