UPDATE ON DUCHESNE BUILDING

Last month we reported on a proposed project for unwed mothers to be located in Matthew's Hall, 38th and Webster, on the Duchesne campus.

Michael Kozlik, who is on the Duchesne board of trustees, has confirmed that the Lutheran Family Services has discontinued their efforts to locate there, and is looking at other sites which will better fit their needs. He also stated that the Mega Corporation listing on the property has expired, and Duchesne is not planning anything more with the building until Fall.

It has been suggested that this would be a good location for senior citizen housing. However, Mr. Kozlik said federal funding for projects for the elderly is extremely hard to get. Letters from neighbors were sent to Senators Exon and Kerrey, against federal funding for the Lutheran Family Services proposal. Perhaps it would also be good for us to write more positive letters to these senators urging their help in getting federal funding for housing for the elderly, which would be more appropriate for this location

Let us continue to work together with the Bemis Park and Joslyn Castle Associations for the improvement of our whole area. There is strength in numbers.
