COMMUNITY POLICING

The guest speakers at the July, 1993, General Membership meeting were Sgt. Dave Allen, Officer Jeff Baker, and Officer Michael Versch of the Omaha Police Department. They were very informative and made several suggestions, such as the development of a neighborhood directory. They also discussed public drinking and loud music complaints indicating they are able to pursue these problems further when an individual is willing to sign a complaint. A suggestion was made that several people could sign a complaint rather than one individual. (Looks like they were telling us that we need more neighborhood watch groups.)

The officers suggested that the neighborhood prioritize concerns and inform them of these priorities. The concerns discussed included street drinking, loud music, underage drinking, parking violations, and unlicensed automobiles. The night following our meeting, Officers Baker and Versch were noticed making an arrest at one of our hot spots. They have made several subsequent arrests and their efforts are making quite an impact on some of our law-violating citizens.

Community policing — what a wonderful idea!

ART IN THE PARK COMMITTEE MEETS

In an effort to improve and beautify the neighborhood, the GPNA Art in the Park Committee is sponsoring a research and planning project to place a sculpture or fountain in Gifford Park.

Several members of the Association have formed a committee to implement the project and have met with local artists (Catherine Ferguson and Les Bruning), to review possible options for the design and placement of the artwork. After a research phase to determine the exact dimensions and materials involved, the project will be taken before the City for final approval. The Art in the Park committee hopes to place the artwork in the park in the summer of 1995.

Currently the committee is involved in an attempt to raise funds for this project, so that further development can begin. A raffle and art auction are being planned to help raise the necessary funds, but donations from individuals interested in helping to improve this mid city park are welcome.
