PI KAPPA ALPHA FRATERNITY CLEANS UP



SPRING CLEANUP REPORT

The Gifford Park Neighborhood cleanup crew rolled into Gifford Park early (about 8:00 a.m.) Saturday morning, April 9th, to set up shop. Seven hours and seven dumpsters later, the cleanup crew packed up and "crawled" home after another satisfying neighborhood cleanup effort. There is always room for improvement and we could have used more volunteers, but after all was said and done, the cleanup crew hammered out these impressive totals:

7 each 20 cy dumpsters (packed with care)
3 each City of Omaha dumptrucks
\$169 GPNA memberships
\$260 donations
\$32 garage sale items
\$131 salvage items (appliances, metal, tires, batteries)

The focus was on cleaning up our neighborhood's streets, yards, and parks. Our neighborhood cleanup was part of the annual "city-wide" cleanup made possible by the city of Omaha and keep Omaha beautiful providing the dumpsters for cleanup day. The GPNA wishes to thank these two organizations for doing an outstanding job of making this program a success year after year. 
