

From the Desk of the President

I want to start by saying a few words about our past president Jim Wilwerding whom I have had the opportunity to work with the last couple of years. Jim has done an outstanding job for the GPNA. He has always been there to support all neighborhood association committees and activities. Jim was as committed as anyone in trying to keep Yates School as our neighborhood school, and when we had the shootings in our neighborhood this spring, Jim led the GPNA to turn a negative event into an opportunity to do a police survey and make some good happen. Jim's work on the Weeds & Litter Committee has led to most of the neighborhood looking in good shape as far as lawns mowed and litter picked up. His monthly newsletter articles were always very interesting and informative. Many thanks to Jim's wife Kathleen for her help and support. She not only participates in many of the Association's activities, but her work behind the scenes made Jim's job run smoother I'm sure. On behalf of the GPNA, we thank Jim and Kathleen for their service and commitment to the neighborhood, and we're very proud of their efforts.

Just a quick history of how I fit into the puzzle. I have lived in the neighborhood since 1986 and been involved with the GPNA since 1989. I first became involved with the neighborhood association when **Jim Windorski**, GPNA president at the time, asked me to head up the neighborhood cleanup. Jim gave me lots of ideas, support and direction. What really impressed me though was the outpouring of support from neighborhood volunteers on cleanup day. It's a great feeling to experience neighbors working hard and having fun together as they participate in our cleanups and other events that the GPNA has been a part of for over 10 years — that's what keeps me involved with this organization.

What has kept the GPNA going? The hard work and dedication put in by our past presidents Jim Windorski, Ron Yates, John Lynch, Leo Wilwerding and Jim Wilwerding, and the support they have received from neighborhood volunteers every step of the way. Most of the work of the Association is accomplished by the committee chairpersons and without their efforts there would be no GPNA.

There is no question we need more people to help accomplish the goals of the GPNA. This seems to be a challenge for many volunteer organizations today – attracting and maintaining people to do the work. I personally feel I can do a better job of encouraging people to become involved in the neighborhood association. How can you become involved? Come to our monthly meetings. General membership meetings are held the first Thursday of each month at 7:00 p.m. at St. Joseph Hospital (no meeting in July) – we discuss neighborhood concerns and usually have a guest speaker (cookies and coffee are also provided by St. Joseph Hospital). Executive board meetings are held the third Thursday of each month at the GPNA Office (33rd & California) at 7:00 p.m. – we discuss current GPNA business and plan for upcoming events. Everyone is welcome to attend either meeting.

Helping out with annual events such as spring and fall cleanups, Easter egg hunt, garage sale, tennis program, holiday banquet, and PKA Fraternity Haunted House are great opportunities to participate in the neighborhood. We also have a Watch Group made up of volunteers who patrol the streets every Friday and Saturday night, and we can always use more help. One of the best ways to

show your support is to buy a GPNA membership – just \$5 for single and \$8 for family memberships. See the article on page 1 of this newsletter for additional membership information. And finally I ask everyone to get involved on your own block by taking the time to get to know your neighbors and ask if they need help. If you have any concerns that the GPNA can help with, please call me or any of the phone numbers listed on page 2.

We will not have a meeting in July since this is a time when many people take vacations. However there are a number of things going on in the neighborhood. Our new membership year began June 1. We currently have 144 paid memberships. There is a membership application on the back page of this newsletter for anyone who would like to join. The Sun Dawg shack is active with kids again this year in Gifford Park. Anyone wishing to help with games, sports, arts, crafts and other activities is encouraged to stop down to the park during weekdays 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. A bike safety day at St. Joseph Hospital is being organized for Saturday, July 10 - information will be posted soon in the local businesses. The annual summer tennis program is being planned for August in Gifford Park. This is the 8th year for the GPNA Tool Lending program. Lawnmowers rent for just \$5/day and have been used 10 times this season. Anyone can rent tools and you do not have to be a GPNA member. We also have a short list of neighborhood people who will mow or do other yardwork (for a reasonable fee of course).

The Yates School PTA is working for solutions to solve a potential busing problem. At the time this article was written, Omaha Public Schools will not bus our neighborhood kids to Kellom, which is our new neighborhood school because much of our area's residents live within 1 ½ miles of Kellom so kids are expected to walk or find their own transportation. This is yet another disappointment of losing Yates as our neighborhood school.

We are considering plans to have a Gifford Park Day next spring. Some of the early thoughts are to have a kids' parade, cookout in the park, kids games, music, raffle, adult games, etc. A few years ago the GPNA had a Gifford Park Day with some of the same events. We will need to organize a committee soon to get the ball rolling. Please consider being part of this event.

In closing, as GPNA president, my job is to serve the membership, so I encourage anyone to share your ideas and suggestions with myself or any of the other GPNA board members. As far as priorities, I feel public safety and communication of information are at the top of the list. I ask for everyone's continued support to work on these issues as well as others. Have a great summer!





Hillside Court Apartments Undergo Major Renovation

A transformation is taking place in the Gifford Park neighborhood that will surely have a positive effect on the whole area. Larry Hoffman has purchased the Hillside Court Apartments on 31st St. between Davenport and Chicago Streets (just east of Yates School) and is in the process of restoring them into updated units. For the past several months, Larry's work crew has been busy performing a complete renovation of the buildings and surrounding property. Larry's overall plan for the apartments is to turn the formerly "slummed out" apartments into an upscale complex with plenty of curb appeal to attract middle income residents. Larry has virtually gutted the existing structures and added all new oak kitchens with dishwashers, air conditioning, ceramic tile showers, bathroom fixtures, and oak floors. A well-lit parking lot has been added to the central area of the complex. The exteriors that face the parking lot have been painted and green awnings will be added. He is especially interested in keeping up the grounds around the buildings; a stone retaining wall has been installed and trees have been planted, with more landscaping planned. A six foot high wrought iron fence will surround the complex to provide security. There are 70 units in the complex, which will rent for \$395 (1 bedroom) and \$470 (2 bedroom) per month. The target occupants are people who work at nearby institutions (Mutual of Omaha, St. Joseph's Hospital) or are professional or graduate students at Creighton or UNMC, with annual incomes of at least \$20,000.

The Hillside project is not the first for Larry; he has "rehab-ed" property in the 31st and Dewey and 25th and Harney areas. His business is to buy older, neglected buildings, make improvements to turn them into more upscale residences, and then manage them. Larry explained that the Hillside Court Apartments held a certain appeal to him, and he felt that they needed "new life breathed into them." Larry said that there has been plenty of interest in the apartments, and he receives several phone calls a day from prospective renters. The first apartments in the complex are due to be occupied around July 15th with all new residents. Welcome to the Gifford Park neighborhood, Larry, and we hope your business venture is very successful!



The new owner of the Hillside Court Apartments, Larry Hoffman, stands at the entrance to the completely refurbished complex. Work on the project began in January, and the first new tenants are due to move in July 15th.



New sidewalks and a stone retaining wall are but a few of the improvements that Larry had made to the property. He plans to landscape the grounds around the apartments and install a fence around the entire complex. Music to My Ears

I like music. And I know a lot of other people like music too. Unfortunately, I tend not to like their kind of music, and I suspect they could happily live without being exposed to mine. Obviously, this can be a source of conflict in a neighborhood, especially if I wanted to listen outdoors at high volume, and others wanted to do the same. Fortunately, there is a city ordinance to address this issue. Sometimes referred to as the "Sound Truck" ordinance, it reads in part that "no person shall play, use, or operate a ...machine or other device for reproducing sound... in or on public property... unless the volume of amplified sound shall be so controlled that it will not be audible for a distance in excess of one hundred (100) feet from the source." The ordinance in reference to residential property indicates that no person shall play music in or on "residential property, whether a unit of a multiple family residential dwelling or a sindle family dwelling structure, unless the volume of amplified sound shall be so controlled that it will not be audible in any adjoining unit."

Presumably, this means that I can listen to my music so long as it does not disturb my neighbor, and my neighbor can listen to music so long as I am not disturbed by it. Which sounds like a good rule for making and keeping good neighbors.

Residents Warned of Phone Scam

A GPNA member received information that she wished to pass along to neighbors concerning a long distance telephone scam that has been occurring locally. According to the memo she received, people have been receiving telephone calls from an individual identifying himself as an AT&T service tecnician that was running a test on their telephone line. He stated that to complete the test they should touch nine(9), zero(0), pound sign (#), and hang up. Individuals who were suspicious contacted the phone company and were informed that by pushing 90#, you give the individual that called you access to your telephone line and allows them to place a long distance telephone call, with the charge appearing on your telephone bill. This scam appears to be originating from many local jails/ prisons. The author of the memo called GTE Security and verified that this is definitely possible. DO NOT press 90# for ANY-ONE. It may give the caller access to your phone line to make long distance calls ANYWHERE! Neighbors should be aware that there are various phone scams that occur from time to time, and suspicious calls should be reported to the phone company immediately. Be careful who you give out information to over the phone!
