The President's Column

I hope you all have had the opportunity to let the GPNA know if you plan to attend the annual Holiday Banquet December 2, 7:00 p.m. This wonderful banquet is hosted again by St. Joseph Hospital and is free to all current GPNA members. Invitations were also sent to other individuals and organizations which the GPNA regularly works with. We ask that you RSVP as soon as possible – call Jean 344-0722, Sue 342-2795 or Chris 342-6006. It is a time for neighbors to enjoy a great meal and get together during the holiday season. Special thanks go to Jean Peck, who as Holiday Banquet Committee Chair organized the calling committee, sent out invitations, and made this year's centerpieces. The GPNA is very grateful to St. Joseph Hospital for being such a generous neighbor year after year.

Last month I mentioned steps the GPNA is taking toward the goal of safer streets, in particular 33rd Street. These steps generally include building relationships with individuals closest to the problems and in a position to do something about them. We have met with Police, City Code Enforcement, City Weeds & Litter, the City Prosecutor's Office, property owners, business owners and residents to work on solutions to familiar problems. Police have identified a number of individuals who cause many of the problems and who do not reside in our neighborhood. In some instances making property owners aware of specific incidents is enough to correct the problem. Unfortunately, other strategies need to be considered if the problems are on going. Mark and Sandy Saner have been very active meeting with landlords in the 33rd Street area.

Here are some other miscellaneous items worth noting. Plan to participate in this year's Holiday Lighting contest. GPNA volunteers will view neighborhood lights Sunday night December 19 – the top three displays will each receive a \$10 gift certificate to California Tacos. Encourage your neighbors to decorate. I recently attended a meeting with the Military Avenue Neighborhood Association (Hamilton St. to the Northwest Radial Highway). There was discussion about the Omaha Planning Department regarding an amendment to the Master Plan to allow the building of a large grocery store and a sizable free-standing drug store near the intersection of Military Avenue, Northwest Radial Highway, and Fontenelle Blvd. This is still a long way off at this point. At the last GPNA meeting, Subby Anzaldo told us Creighton University wants to close Burt Street east of 30th Street north of their campus for the purpose of adding greenspace. Jefferson Square Neighborhood Association is opposed to this plan.

Because of the holiday season, the December Executive Board Meeting has been cancelled. The January general meeting will be held on Thursday, January 6th, 7:00 p.m., at St. Joseph Hospital. The executive board will meet again on January 20th at the GPNA office.

A final note: the GPNA wishes everyone a safe and healthy holiday season! I am continually impressed by the dedication and commitment of the people of the Gifford Park neighborhood, not just GPNA members but also everyone who does their part to make our neighborhood a better place to live.
