GPNA Spring Cleanup Set For May 6

The Gifford Park Neighborhood Assocation Spring Cleanup has been scheduled for Saturday, May 6th, from 10 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. in the Gifford Park south parking lot. The cleanup is for all GPNA members and for those who donate time or money to the Association.

Items that will <u>not</u> be taken at the dumpster site are as follows: concrete, tree brush, yard waste, hazardous materials, paint, oil, or herbicides. Although tree brush will not be allowed at the dumpster site, it can be taken to the city's chipper site at 11th & Locust on April 15th and 29th, and May 6th, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. only. It has not been determined at this time whether tires will be accepted; see the May newsletter for details. A new policy will be in effect this year: a fee of \$5.00 each for disposal of couches and stuffed chairs will be assessed. As in past years, \$10.00 will be charged for each air conditioner or refrigerator.

If help is needed, volunteers will haul your trash for a small donation to the Association. If you need the hauling service, it is very important that you call one of the following numbers prior to the cleanup date: Chris 342-6006 or Mike 341-8224.

As usual, volunteers are always needed to help out with the cleanup. If you own a pickup, and/or have some free time on May 6th, your help would be greatly appreciated. Please call one of the numbers above to volunteer.

The President's Column

Springtime in the Gifford Park Neighborhood is always busy. In fact, I'm running more behind schedule than usual so I will try to be brief with my notes and just hit the highlights; most of the details will be covered in the rest of the newsletter.

I've got good news and bad news. First the bad news. OPPD rejected our grant application for \$5,000 for tree planting in Gifford Park. We submitted very detailed plans provided by the City Parks Planning Department and thought we had a good chance to get all or part of the grant. However there are other opportunities that we will pursue to get funding for tree planting. The City will soon be making changes to a few existing park items - the old playground equipment in the east park will stay for now. Now the good news. Show Wagon, which is a youth talent competition, is coming back to Gifford Park in June and July. Sun Dawgs Youth Summer Program will again be in the park starting in June. St. Joseph's Hospital is planning another Bike Rodeo for our neighborhood in May. The GPNA is planning a one-day tennis blitz also in May. Other events coming up are the Easter Egg Hunt April 22 and Spring Cleanup May 6. The Pen-Pal program between the GPNA and Kellom students continues. We are still formulating ideas and possible dates for a Gifford Park Day. Election of GPNA Officers is coming up in June; please consider taking on a leadership position in our organization (the slate of officer candidates must be decided on by the May meeting). We wish to congratulate Mark Saner for completing the 9-session Citizen Academy, which exposes participants to all aspects of the police department.

Plan to attend this month's GPNA meeting; **Bob Sivick** will be our guest speaker. Bob recently took over as our new City Councilman, replacing Subby Anzaldo. We plan to have a brief update on police activities in the area. We are also making plans to do something special at our May meeting. We plan to provide ice cream and focus on getting more parents and kids to attend the meeting – especially with a number of youth events coming up in May and June. Let us know if you have other ideas on this or any other matter.

And finally, at our March meeting, the GPNA recognized **Sue Wilwerding** and **Mike** and **Candy Bacome** for their outstanding dedication to producing and distributing this newsletter. If you didn't already know, Sue has been the editor for over three years and has never missed a deadline. Anyone who has produced a newsletter understands the difficult task of balancing appropriate content, various writers, grammar, last-minute changes, pictures and graphics, timing and a deadline - every month. It would be unfair not to mention Sue's husband **Terry** for his work with taking many of the pictures you see. Mike and Candy Bacome have done the job of newsletter distribution for over four years. Again, anyone who has done this job has a true appreciation of the time and commitment involved with seeing that during the odd-numbered months 1,500 newsletters get hand-delivered to most addresses in the Gifford Park neighborhood. Then on the even-numbered months, nearly 200 newsletters are stuffed, stamped, addressed and mailed to all GPNA members. Great job Sue, Terry, Mike and Candy!

Neighborhood Maintenance Program To Begin Soon

The GPNA is starting a project to hopefully bring problem solving down to a block by block level. The project is called **Neighborhood Maintenance** and the goal is for each block to have a captain to document problems in their area. Each block captain will be provided a list of all property addresses along with the owner's name. Each property address will have a form to document problems such as criminal behavior, ordinance and code violations, weeds and litter, etc. The block captain will record information such as the date, issue, agency contacted, and action taken. This information can be very useful if we need to contact the owner (police and other agencies) to get a handle on chronic problem properties, especially with absentee landlords, of which our neighborhood has many.

Many thanks to Betsy Noble and Jackie Lynch for a lot of hard work to get this project going and providing a draft at the last GPNA meeting. The next step is to identify block captains; this is where we need your help. Betsy and Jackie have made the forms simple to fill out and maintain. 
