
### Spring Cleanup Scheduled for June 16

The Joslyn Castle Neighborhood Association's cleanup site is the area's tire disposal location (the parking lot across from 141 North 41st St.)

It really boils down to getting to know your neighbors and asking them to get involved. I believe now more than ever that the Gifford Park neighborhood has tremendous opportunities for becoming an even stronger neighborhood, but it takes commitment and effort from neighborhood leadership, which is all of us. I realize everyone is busy these days, but energy put toward our neighborhood will be well worth it. Please consider getting involved with the GPNA by attending monthly meetings or participating in events. If you are already involved, the challenge is to share your knowledge and encourage others. This is vital to the overall health of our neighborhood. There are several opportunities in June to make a difference – GPNA meetings, neighborhood walks, cleanup, Show Wagon and music in the park, Sun Dawgs...or start your own project.
