The Gifford Park Neighborhood Association (GPNA) has been working very hard to improve the appearance and safety of our neighborhood. The goal of the GPNA is to improve the neighborhood and make it a better place for all residents, and we would ask our new student neighbors to become a part of this effort. The largest part of being a good neighbor is consideration for others. First, we ask students to be considerate in terms of noise, especially after 10 pm. Also, please do not litter, and help us to keep our neighborhood picked up. Many of us pick up trash that we did not leave and we ask that you would help us by doing the same. Finally, consider coming to our quarterly neighborhood meetings and joining the GPNA. A single membership is only \$10 and the membership form is on the back page of this newsletter. We welcome students for the upcoming year, and we hope that you will help us continue to make the Gifford Park neighborhood a better place to live, work, learn and play!

The community garden at 35th & Cass Street has benefited this season from timely rains which have kept everything growing (weeds too!). Everyone is welcome to walk through the garden and Adventure Playground and check out the gardens, flowers, chickens, bees, compost, two-story tree house, and memorial brick dedication feature. Our Youth Garden (GPYG) program began May 10 with our "Season Opening" event and ends with our "Pizza Garden Harvest Party" August 23rd. Youth participants gardened in 44 raised beds (each 30" x 30" plots) and learned from volunteer presenters on these topics: rocks, building birdhouses, music, nature journaling, yoga, making chicken treats, hydroponics, insects, composting, pickling, cooking & nutrition, herbs, seed bombs, and art. Big Muddy Urban Farm

Things are productive at the urban farm this season. We have harvested over 500 lbs of produce in total so far, including over 120 lbs of onions! We have a lot of corn, peppers, squash, tomatoes, cucumbers, and potatoes coming on too. We have made a ton of salsa, pizza sauce, and chili base. I am pretty happy with how things are going this year. The refugee group farming the front half of 34th & Burt Street plot are doing a fantastic job. They have a lot of corn, peppers, and eggplant coming. Our partnership with Global Roots is going great too. They are utilizing the Cottage Grove Plot this season. So, if you see them up there while you're walking about, say hi! In addition, if you see us out in the Burt Street garden come check things out and get some bounty! If we don't cross paths you can always come by the Big Muddy garage on Monday nights from 6pm-7pm to get some fresh produce. We also have been donating produce to a local food distribution group that operates out of the Big Muddy garage, but soon you will find Big Muddy produce at Yates Illuminates! Keep Your Eyes Peeled - Volunteering Events:

- -August 9th @ 10 a.m.: We will be harvesting our potatoes. Join us in the fun and go home with some tasty potatoes!
- -August 23rd @ 10 a.m.: Join us in harvest!
- -September 20th @ 10 a.m.: Join us as we expand our garden beds to increase production capabilities.
- -September 27th @ 10 a.m.: Join us as we clean up the garden and prep some beds for winter.


Community Bicycle Project of Omaha

Exhi-BIKE-tion is a curated community art show celebrating bicycles and cycling as modes of transportation, transformation, resistance, and release. Co-organized by Yuanjun Chen, and in the historic Joslyn Castle, the exhibition explores how biking shapes the way we move, connect, and imagine our lives from everyday commutes to childhood memories, critical mass rides to quiet moments in motion. This event is also a fundraiser for The Community Bike Project of Omaha, the city's only

nonprofit dedicated to providing free access to bikes, tools, and cycling education for people of all ages. Exhi-BIKE-tion opens to the public Thusday, September 18th with a closing celebration to follow Friday, September 26th. Coming Soon to Turner Park – Lady Liberty By Jim Thompson

A while ago it was reported that a replacement Statue of Liberty was being planned for installation in Turner Park. The Advisory Committee has been working to make this a reality and is getting closer. Approval was obtained from the Omaha Pubic Arts Board and the next step is fundraising.

For those who may not remember, the original Statue was dedicated on July 4, 1951, as a major project of the Boy Scouts of America. Further, there was a national effort by the Scouts to have penny drives to buy one of the statues and place her in various cities, depending on the success of each of the troops. A total of 200 were placed around the country during 1949-1952. About 20 years ago an inventory was taken, earning an Eagle Scout award to the young fellow, and it was discovered there were 100 missing, 100 still standing. The Omaha icon was classified as missing. She is close to reappearing, brand new, cast by a local artist.



This effort will display the grand lady in a designated area in the southeast section of Turner Park. An engineering/design firm has been engaged to work out the beautiful details, including a granite plaza to hold the 8-foot granite base for the Statue. Funding is expected to come from some noted foundations and donors. The highlight of this campaign will be a "coin drive" through the scouting chapter. It will take a lot more than pennies this time around to buy a new Statue. Perhaps with the phasing out of the penny, this would be a great opportunity to turn those in for such a good cause. We are fortunate to be working through the non-profit Omaha Parks Foundation and the account is open and ready!

This project will join others around the country to inspire us and remind us of the freedoms we need to hold dear and continue to strengthen. Locating the Statue back in Turner Park restores the historical perspective and with the advent of the Omaha Street Car Project, will surely be a "blue pin" stop on the map for many to relish and enjoy.
